THE UNDER 16 Coca Cola Binatang side has returned from a brave campaign in Queensland.

Heading down to Australia on the 6th of April, the 25 PNG lads faced tough adversaries in the 2010 Under 16 State Championships.

Game 1 saw the boys take on the Northern Raiders on the 6th of April. The Boys put up a high quality of football despite losing 50 to 40.

The 10 point loss against the Raiders was a defining moment for AFL football in PNG, signifying the positive

steps AFLPNG has taken.

Game 2 was a great result, defeating the Sun Coast Power by 13 points in what was an uplifting game for the boys.

The last game saw the Kookaburras knock the Binatangs over 76 to 47.

It was a great championship for the Binatangs, and big congratulations to all involved.

The Under 14 Binatangs will head down to Queensland for the U/14s championship commencing on June 28.
